Qualifications. The General Services Administration maintains strict guidelines regarding the addition of qualified fire protection engineers to the design teams involved with Federal construction projects. The mission of the fire protection consultant is to apply sound engineering principals that will most economically and efficiently meet the GSA objectives of life safety and environmental management.

Scope of Services. GSA expects the fire protection consultant to be involved in all phases of the project from concept development to final working drawings. As a member of the design team, the consultant must contribute fire protection expertise in areas ranging from fire resistance and fuel load to protection, communications and supervisory system design.

Working Relationships. The ultimate goal is a close working relationship between the government agency, the design team and the fire protection consultant. This relationship leads to a comprehensive, carefully planned fire protection and security master plan. The plan must provide for integration with other building systems and assure proper function, serviceability and compliance with government standards for all fire protection and security systems.
